To Kill A Mockingbird

1962 - NR - 130 minutes

Wednesday, August 3, 7:15 (PMR)

Southern comforts abound in this big-screen adaptation of Harper Lee's novel as lawyer Atticus Finch (Gregory Peck, in an Oscar-winning role) defends an innocent black man (Brock Peters) against rape charges but ends up in a maelstrom of hate and prejudice. Meanwhile, with help from a friend (John Megna), Finch's children, Jem (Phillip Alford) and Scout (Mary Badham), set their sights on making contact with a reclusive neighbor (Robert Duvall).

South Pacific

2001 - PG - 135 minutes

Saturday, August 6, 7:15 (PMR)

Glenn Close and Harry Connick Jr. star in this TV remake of the classic 1949 musical. Set on a remote island during World War II, the story follows two parallel romances: one between Nellie Forbush (Close), a Navy nurse, and a wealthy French plantation owner (Rade Sherbedgia); the other between a native girl (Natalie Mendoza), and Lt. Joseph Cable (Connick), a young American Marine whose secret mission on the island could help change the course of the war.

Babe: Pig in the City

1998 - G - 95 minutes

Saturday, August 13, 7:15 (PMR)

After winning the sheepherding contest, Babe (voiced by Elizabeth Daily) comes home to the reality that Farmer and Mrs. Hoggett (James Cromwell and Magda Szubanski) may lose their land. The prize porker and Mrs. Hoggett go to the big city in a desperate attempt to save the farm but become separated. On his own, Babe performs with the circus, is chased by stray dogs and becomes a leader among animals in director George Miller's Oscar-nominated sequel.

The King's Speech

2010 - R - 119 minutes

Wednesday, August 17, 7:15 (PMR)

Britain's King George VI (Colin Firth) struggles with an embarrassing stutter for years until he seeks help from unorthodox Australian speech therapist Lionel Logue (Geoffrey Rush) in this biographical drama that chalked up multiple Academy Awards, including Best Picture. Logue's pioneering treatment and unlikely friendship give the royal leader a sense of confidence that serves him and his country well during the dark days of World War II.

Fever Pitch

2005 - PG13- 103 minutes

Saturday, August 20, 7:15 (PMR)

Everything's going great between baseball fanatic Ben (Jimmy Fallon) and his new girlfriend, Lindsay (Drew Barrymore). But when spring rolls around and baseball season begins, Ben's overwhelming obsession with the Boston Red Sox threatens to destroy their relationship. Ione Skye and Kadee Strickland co-star in this Farrelly brothers comedy based on Nick Hornby's novel, which originally had its protagonist obsessed with soccer.

The Russians are Coming...

1966 - NR - 126 minutes

Wednesday, August 24, 7:15 (PMR)

A Russian submarine runs aground near a small New England town, and it's up to Lt. Rozanov (Alan Arkin) as the Russians' second-in-command to covertly secure a towboat to avoid an international confrontation. When he hooks up with residents such as Walt Whittaker (Carl Reiner) and the police chief (Brian Keith), all hell breaks loose. This classic comedy earned three Oscar nominations, including one for Best Picture.

The Audrey Hepburn Story

2000 - PG - 133 minutes

Saturday, August 27, 7:15 (PMR)

Jennifer Love Hewitt stars as Audrey Hepburn in this made-for-TV biography of the legendary actress and humanitarian. The story follows Hepburn from her troubled childhood in Europe during World War II to her rise to stardom as one of Hollywood's loveliest and most sophisticated leading ladies. The film re-creates some of the actress's most memorable on-screen moments, including scenes from Breakfast at Tiffany's.

IMAX: Hubble

2010 - G - 45 minutes

Wednesday, August 31, 7:15 (PMR)

Actor Leonardo DiCaprio narrates this awe-inspiring documentary that takes viewers on a visually stunning IMAX 3-D journey to explore the faraway galaxies viewed by the Hubble Space Telescope in its travels throughout the cosmos. During the mission, astronauts walk in space, contend with successes and setbacks, view nebulae and galaxies, observe the birth of a star, witness a powerful supernova and much more.
