“Taylored” Thoughts for June

My great, great grandfather was a stowaway on a ship that left Northumberland England and landed in Halifax, Nova Scotia. And so, the line of Fowlie’s began in Canada. My grandfather was born there and his family moved and lived in the St. John, New Brunswick area. It was there my grandfather, William Fowlie, met my grandmother, Rhoda. And so, my ancestry began.

My grandparents had seven children: Elmer, (Pete), William, Jennie, Vida, Rhoda Dorothy, Myrtle and Frieda. My mother, Vida, was the first child born in the United States. My grandfather Fowlie had come to the United States looking for work, and found it working for the state of Maine, department of transportation. They settled in Harmony, Maine.

My grandfather became a naturalized citizen, but much to his dismay, my grandmother never would! She worked in local woolen mills and raised her family, but would never become a citizen of the United States. Each year in January, she would trek to the post office and register as an alien. She was VERY quick to remind the family, that she was an ENGLISH Canadian!! As far as my mother recounted to me, this was the only thing my grandparents really fought about! My grandfather firmly believed that if you lived, worked, and paid taxes here, you should be a citizen. Not so my grandmother. My grandmother would spout, “Long Live the Queen” just to see my grandfather become unglued!

My grandfather was proud to be a citizen of the United States and instilled in his family the very values he believed in. Being a citizen to him carried both rights and responsibilities. He felt that citizens should work toward the betterment of their community through economic participation, a good work ethic, and certainly the right (obligation) to vote. He felt you should look after your neighbor, volunteer to help in the community where you could and to make sure that your children understood how lucky they were.

Gran Torino

2008 - R - 116 minutes

Wednesday, June 1, 7:15 (PMR)

Curmudgeonly Korean War veteran Walt Kowalski (Clint Eastwood, who also directs) must confront his Hmong immigrant neighbors -- and his own long-held prejudices -- when the family's teenage son, Thao (Bee Vang), tries to steal Walt's beloved 1972 Gran Torino. Walt soon assumes the unlikely role of guardian angel to young Thao and his sister Sue (Ahney Her), both of whom are vulnerable to local gang influences.

Walk the Line

2005 - PG13 - 136 minutes

Saturday, June 4, 7:15 (PMR)

This critically acclaimed biopic distills country singer Johnny Cash's (Joaquin Phoenix, in an Academy Award-nominated role) transformation from man to icon -- from his hardscrabble days on an Arkansas farm to his time inside Memphis's Sun Studios, where he finally found a voice for his talents. Reese Witherspoon won an Oscar for her portrayal of Cash's beloved wife, June, alongside co-stars Robert Patrick and Shelby Lynne.

Babe

1995 - G - 92 minutes

Wednesday, June 8, 7:15 (PMR)

Director Chris Noonan's tale of precocious piglet Babe's (voiced by Christine Cavanaugh) struggle to fit in and become a champion sheepherder won the hearts of audiences and critics. Nominated for seven Academy Awards (including Best Picture), Babe won the Visual Effects Oscar, and everything from farmer Arthur Hoggett (James Cromwell) to the multitude of farm animals to the humble, edgy script is remarkably appealing for kids and adults alike.

Scent of a Woman

1992 - R - 157 minutes

Saturday, June 11, 7:15 (PMR)

Hoping to earn some extra cash during the Thanksgiving holiday, poor prep-school student Charlie Simms (Chris O'Donnell) agrees to look after blind -- and cantankerous -- Lt. Col. Frank Slade (Al Pacino, in a tour-de-force performance). Though the callow student and jaded colonel are mismatched, their relationship grows as Simms follows Slade around Manhattan on a string of wild escapades, and Slade is unmasked as a sentimental romantic.

Mystery Woman: Snapshot

2005 - NR - 87 minutes

When amateur sleuth Samantha Kinsey's (Kellie Martin) friend Barbara (Patricia McCormack) is left out of her wealthy brother's will, she accuses the family of foul play -- and promptly turns up dead. Suspects abound, from the brother's trophy wife to the crafty stepdaughter and her selfish fiancé. Can Samantha untangle the web of deceit and family rivalries before she becomes the next victim?

2009 - PG - 120 minutes

Hilary Swank stars as famed aviator Amelia Earhart in this dramatic biopic that follows the daring pilot's rise from obscurity in Kansas to her troubled marriage to businessman George Putnam (Richard Gere), who recruited her for her first transatlantic flight. Mira Nair (The Namesake, Vanity Fair) directs; Ewan McGregor, Joe Anderson, Christopher Eccleston and Mia Wasikowska co-star.

Angela's Ashes

2000 - R - 145 minutes

Saturday, June 25, 7:15 (PMR)

This adaptation of Frank McCourt's best-selling memoir tells the grim story of the author's impoverished childhood in 1940s Ireland, a time of devastating deprivation spent alongside starving siblings, a long-suffering mother and an alcoholic father. Emily Watson and Robert Carlyle shine in the pivotal roles of McCourt's struggling parents in this captivating biographical drama from director Alan Parker (Fame, Midnight Express).

Galapagos: IMAX

1999 - NR - 40 minutes

Wednesday, June 29, 7:15 (PMR)

This IMAX documentary follows Carole Baldwin, a marine biologist from the Smithsonian Institution's National Museum of Natural History, on an astonishing expedition to the Galapagos Islands, a world that is still relatively new and evolving. Descending to depths of 3,000 feet, the scientists find a window into the past and a frontier for exploration. David Clark and Al Giddings direct, while Kenneth Branagh provides narration.
