On Golden Pond

1981 - PG - 109 minutes

Wednesday, May 4, 7:15 (PMR)

Henry Fonda -- in his final role -- plays peevish retired professor Norman Thayer, who's making his yearly excursion with his wife (Katharine Hepburn) to their idyllic summerhouse. But a hostile teen left in their care short-circuits the couple's tranquility. After a rocky start, the old man and the boy forge a bond; can Norman do the same with his estranged daughter? Fonda and Hepburn earned top Oscar honors for their peerless performances.

The Sound of Music

1965 - G - 174 minutes

Saturday, May 7, 7:15 (PMR)

In Rodgers and Hammerstein's greatest collaboration, a feisty postulant named Maria (Julie Andrews) is sent to care for the unruly, motherless Von Trapp children. She soon tames them -- and finds herself falling for their stern father (Christopher Plummer). Oscar-winning director Robert Wise used stunning Austrian locations to transform the popular stage musical into a cinema classic in which the hills truly seemed to come alive.

Homeward Bound: The Incredible Journey

1993 - G - 85 minutes

Three household pets -- a lovable golden retriever (voiced by Don Ameche), a sassy cat (Sally Field) and a feisty, funny bulldog pup (Michael J. Fox) -- mistakenly believe their owners have abandoned them in this light-hearted live-action adventure based on Sheila Burnford's novel. In an incredible effort to be reunited with their family, the trio set out together on a journey through the great outdoors that takes them beyond their wildest dreams.

P.S. I Love You

2007 - PG13 - 127 minutes

When she loses her beloved husband Gerry (Gerard Butler) to a brain tumor, grieving widow Holly Kennedy (Hilary Swank) is surprised to learn that he left a series of letters behind to help her cope with the pain of being

without him. As the months drag on, Holly finds messages from Gerry that encourage her to go on living. But will the letters mire her deeper into the past, or will they give her the strength she needs to face the future?

Masterpiece Mystery!: Poirot: Dumb Witness

1997 - Not Rated - 103 minutes

Famed Belgian detective Hercule Poirot (David Suchet) joins Capt. Hastings (Hugh Fraser) for an outing in England's Lake District, where he meets Emily Arundell (Ann Morrish), a wealthy elderly woman who believes one of her would-be heirs is plotting to kill her. As it turns out, her assumption is correct, and it's up to Poirot to sniff out the killer ... with a little help from the victim's pet terrier.

Truman

1995 - PG - 131 minutes

Gary Sinise owns the screen with his performance as U.S. president Harry S. Truman. Coming to power in the shadow of the legendary Franklin Roosevelt, Truman survived near-certain defeat in the 1948 election and led the rebuilding of postwar Europe. Sinise perfectly captures the underrated 33rd president's unpretentious style, which concealed a razor-sharp political will. Diana Scarwid keeps pace as Truman's wife.

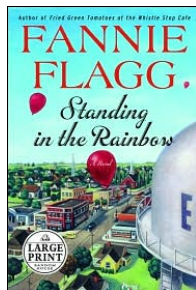
