What is Happy Hour?

There has been some differing opinions on the definition of "Happy Hour". Thanks to google.com,

"Happy hour is a time when a bar or restaurant offers reduced prices on drinks and food to attract customers and boost sales:

Drinks: Bars and restaurants may offer discounted drinks, such as half-price well drinks or two-for-one deals

Food: Restaurants may offer discounted appetizers or other menu items

Time: Happy hour usually takes place in the late afternoon or early evening, between the end of the workday and dinner rush

Happy hour is a marketing strategy that can help restaurants and bars become a go-to spot for after-work drinks. It can also be a cost-effective way to increase order volume and introduce new diners to the restaurant.

The term "happy hour" originated in the US Navy in the early 1900s. Sailors would socialize and drink during scheduled times, and the time became known as "happy hour" because alcohol seemed to make everyone smile."

Miriam-Webster says Happy Hour is "a period of time during which the price of drinks (as at a bar) is reduced or hors d'oeuvres are served free."
